

Easiest Way to Write an Essay Hook

Types of Hook Sentences

Quotation

The most common type of hook is the quotation hook. You start your [essay service](#) with a powerful quote by a famous person. The quote should be relevant to your topic and must come from a reliable source.

Question

Another trick to build someone's interest is to ask them a thought-provoking question. Avoid asking simple yes or no questions that doesn't make the reader think. Remember to answer this question in the rest of your text, so the [do my essay](#) interest remains.

Anecdote

Everyone enjoys reading a funny little story. This is exactly what an anecdote is, a funny incident, or short story relevant to your topic.

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Statistical

Numbers and figures are useful when you want to inform the reader about the facts regarding your topic. Revealing some absurd statistics can really catch the reader's attention.
